Collaboration, variety in primary care practice

There are a lot of good ways for pharmacists to practice, Pharmacist Connie Kraus says. She enjoys the variety, patient contact, and collaboration of being part of a Family Practice clinic. “It stretches you and makes you keep reading a lot,” she says.

Kraus also likes teaching, both as a pharmacy preceptor at the clinic and on campus. Kraus joined the School of Pharmacy faculty in 1993 and began her practice at Wingra Family Medical Center then. She previously practiced in the Pediatric Pulmonary and Pediatric Allergy clinics at UW Hospital from 1980-1993.

“I enjoy the opportunity to work with a variety of non-pharmacist providers,” Kraus says. “We have complementary skills, different training, and different backgrounds, and we all work together to care for patients.”

The primary care clinic has about 20,000 patient visits a year. Kraus helps manage a broad variety of needs—from prevention to acute care to chronic illness. She does patient education and follow-up, and routinely confers with medical residents and physicians.

In one case, a 60-year-old man complained of tiredness and weight loss. Several medications he was taking were prescribed by physicians in other practices. Kraus decided to review his medications for their uses and side effects. Fortunately she had some good medical records and could call his cardiologist. They discussed his medication needs and the possibility of discontinuing some of them. The medical team did discontinue some of his meds and Kraus consulted with the patient on making the change.

Several months later Kraus got a phone call from the patient. “Guess where I am?” he said. “I’m ice skating. I feel so good. I haven’t done this in years!”

“I felt good that we had taken a hard look at his medicine needs and eliminated the use of unnecessary drugs, and his health improved as a result,” says Kraus.

Practitioners at the clinic meet regularly to talk about patient care and about their roles as educators. In addition to consulting on complex cases, they talk about their individual functions and evaluate their practices.

Teaching is a major part of Kraus’ work at the clinic, which also trains medical residents. The residents often consult with Kraus on medications and immunizations during patient visits. Pharmacy students learn to read medical charts, write summary notes, and communicate with non-pharmacy colleagues under Kraus’s tutelage. They also join her in doing follow up with diabetic patients and those taking warfarin.

Family practice providers sometimes make house calls to care for patients.

One patient was hospitalized when she confused her medications, taking too much of one and not enough of another. When Kraus and a student made a home visit, they quickly discovered the problem. The woman kept her pill bottles in a row on the kitchen counter.

“It was clear what had happened,” says Kraus. “The bottles got out of order. We offered to get her a medication box, and that worked splendidly. It was great for the student, too. She got to see a different style of problem solving, outside the clinic.”

Pharmacists in other settings consult and help solve problems, as well, Kraus says, but it can be more challenging than in the clinic where medical records and laboratory results are readily available. Collaborations with health-care providers often develop through informal channels.

A combination of laboratory science, social science and practice was the normal focus for all pharmacy schools at the time. The current trend in pharmacy education is to reduce, or eliminate entirely, the laboratory science component. For this reason, I am concerned about the effect this trend will have on the performance of future pharmacists.

In memoriam: Pharmacist Tom McGregor

Kraus finds her clinic experiences really enhance her classroom teaching. She is often consulted on medication use during pregnancy and lactation, and she gets questions from older women about osteoporosis and cardiovascular disease. She has molded that information into an elective pharmacy course on women's health which she co-teaches with Denise Walbrandt Pigarelli.



"The questions send me back to the references," she says. "Then I turn the information into cases and problems for my students. We give the students problem-solving opportunities, just like in real practice." The information in the Women's Health Pharmacotherapy elective course is taught on an Internet site where several Non-Traditional PharmD students are also learning from it. In addition to the course, Kraus and her colleague have also authored a chapter entitled "Pregnancy And Lactation: Therapeutic Considerations" for the 5th edition of **Pharmacotherapy: A Pathophysiologic Approach**.

Overall, Kraus finds working and teaching in a clinic very exciting. "I get to see a lot of different perspectives because I'm here," she says. "I enjoy working closely with other providers and getting information from them."



Sharing our knowledge; learning from others

Who did you talk to at work this week? Probably a lot of patients. Numerous discussions with physicians. The operating room nurses asked for information on a new drug that is coming out. The hospice nurses wanted to talk about better pain management techniques. A baby's mother called for a recommendation on a decongestant to use with the antibiotic you dispensed. The diabetic educator is planning group education sessions and wants you to participate.

In your life as a pharmacist you can relate to most of these discussions. Throughout the day we share our knowledge with countless people. We, in turn, rely on others—a physician friend, the oncology nurse on sixth floor, the home health nurse with expertise in surgical dressings, or that pharmacist colleague at the hospital or nursing home.

Life has become an exchange of knowledge, but my 33 years in pharmacy have begun to overwhelm me! Four journals. Five newsletters. Piles of junk mail. They are just too much. Even my patients seem to know more about "that one specific drug" than I do—thanks to the Internet, television or *Readers Digest!*

Sometimes I feel I can't absorb everything I need to: details about new drugs, new DUR codes, and the million new rules from the multitude of third party payers and formulary committees. It's all a blur at the end of a long day.

But then I remember those folks who support and encourage me. My technicians remember some billing intricacies. A physician specialist down the hall helps put the new drug in perspective with others. A nurse friend explains the special procedures for running the oncology infusion pump I haven't used in months. And, most importantly, my patients educate me on what their medicine is doing to them—the good and the bad!

The UW School of Pharmacy taught me a lot about the science of medicine, a lot about legislation regarding pharmacy; a lot about absorption, distribution and excretion. But most importantly, they taught me **how** to look, **where** to look, and **whom to ask** to find answers.

Folks like Connie Krause are the leaders in teaching our students to work together with other specialists. My dear friend Larry Boh spent countless hours preparing students to think for themselves, express themselves, and listen to others. My mentors, Win Durant, Dave Zilz, Tom Thielke, Dave Angaran, and many others, prepared me to "stop, look and listen"—and it has worked for me!

You are a member of this Alumni Association because you realize the same things I do. The UW School of Pharmacy has provided us with the knowledge and communication skills to contribute to our community, earn a decent income, raise a family, and enjoy the fruits of our labors. For this I am thankful, and happy to share my excitement with those I interact with each day.

And I need to give back—by taking pride in our new building and in students who need a variety of experiences to round out their educations. I need to support new pharmacists who need guidance to become comfortable in their professional environments. I need to continue my financial support so young pharmacists who will be caring for me in later years get the best possible education. I need to encourage my younger colleagues to remember their experiences and support their School of Pharmacy. I hope you feel the same.

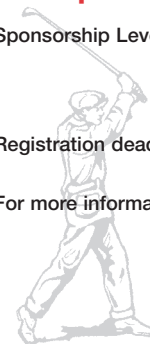

George Zograf has received the Ebert Prize for 2001, recognizing the author of the best report of original investigation in the *APhA Journal of Pharmaceutical Sciences*. It was presented at the annual APhA meeting in San Francisco in March.

Greg Higby MS '80, PhD 84, is editing a new publication called *Apothecary's Cabinet*. This 16-page newsletter contains notes and news about the history of pharmacy. Dave Mott was part of a team of pharmacy researchers last summer conducting the National Pharmacy Workforce Survey: 2000. This survey of pharmacists around the country asked about their work and work environments. The main report is available at the APhA and AACP websites. The study was supported by a grant from the Pharmacy Manpower Project, Inc. Other UW School of Pharmacy graduates involved in the project were Jon C. Schommer, PhD '92, at the University of Minnesota and Willima R. Doucette, PhD '93, at the University of Iowa.

The Kaiser Family Foundation published *Prescription Drug Trends: A Chartbook* in 2000. This project was coordinated by **Dave Kreling**, **Joe Wiederholt** and **Dave Mott** also were authors. The chartbook is the first publication to gather information from various sources to document trends in prescription drug expenditures and associated factors.
